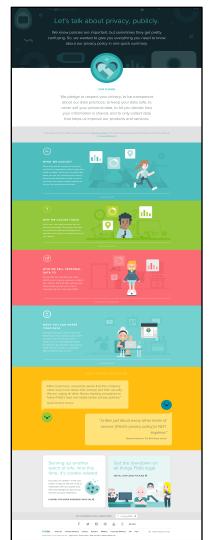

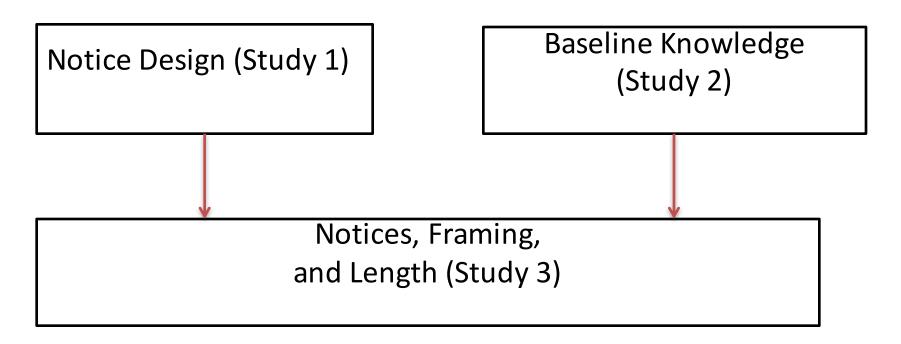

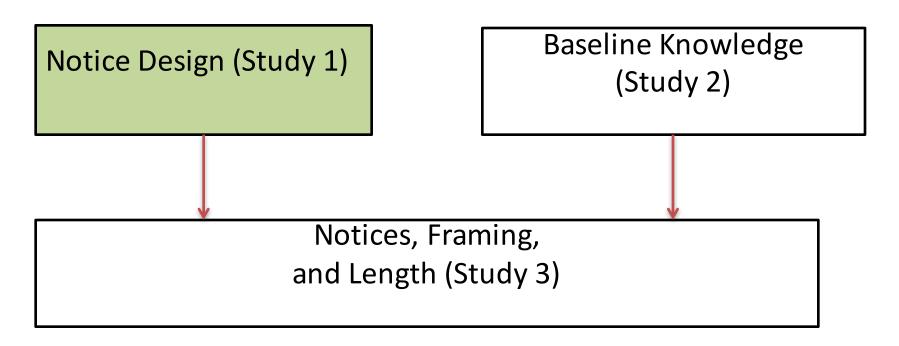
## Addressing this Problem

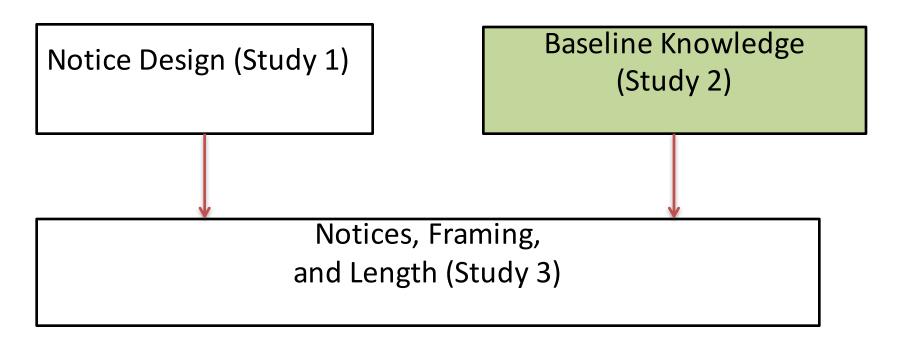
- Short form privacy notices
  - Layered notices (Ben-Shahar 2014) (McDonald 2008)
  - Timing of the notice (Balebako 2015)(Almuhimedi 2015)
  - Format of the notice (Levy 2008)(Earp 2004)
- Framing
  - Providing reasons and consequences can affect concern (Tan 2014)(Shih 2015)
- Proposals to focus on unexpected practices (FTC:IOT 2015)(Ayers 2014)
- Our goal is to test these proposals

### Research Questions

- Does removing unsurprising practices from privacy notices lead to higher overall awareness of privacy practices?
- Does framing practices in positive or negative ways lead to higher or lower overall awareness of privacy practices?
- Does showing a short-form privacy notice increase awareness of Fitness wearable privacy practices?

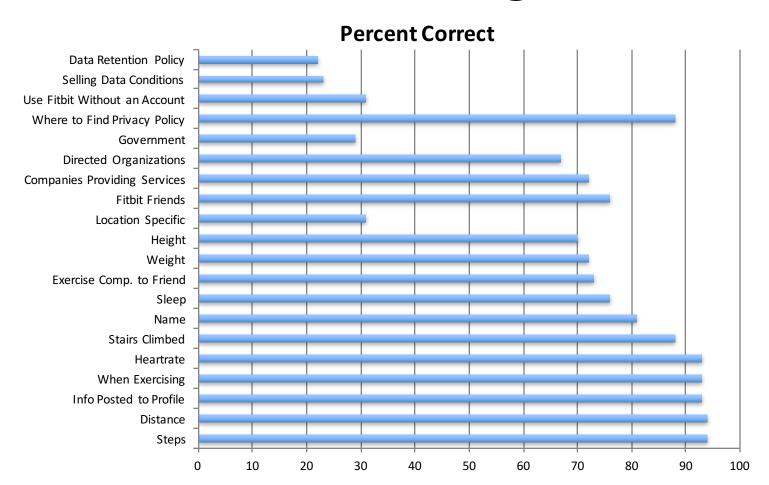

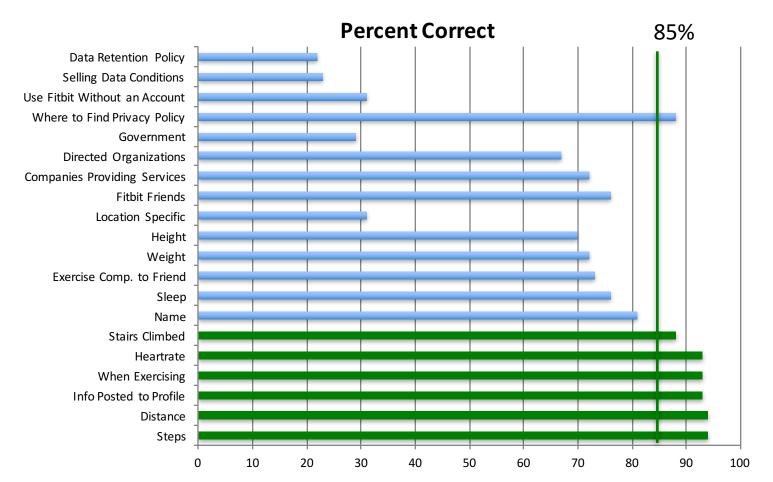

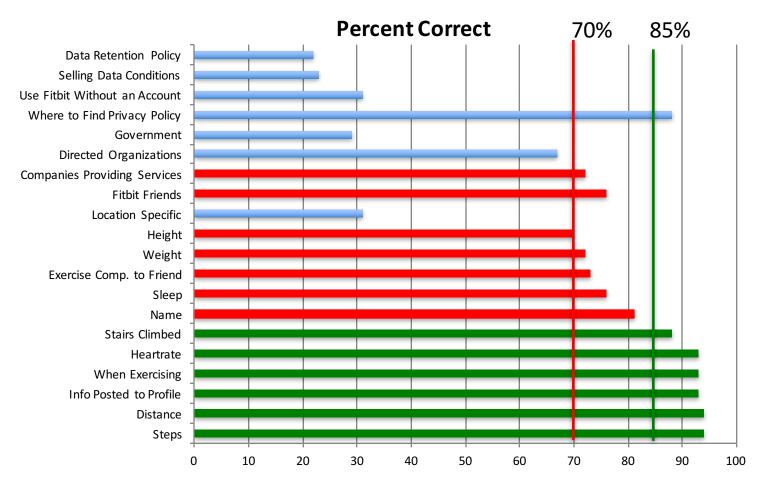

### With an account, Fitbit will colle

- \* Your **location**, when location features, such as maps, are active
- \* Your name, height, and weight
- \* Your steps, distance and stairs climbed
- \* When and how long you exercise
- \* When and how long you sleep
- \* Your **heartrate** throughout the day
- \* Exercise compared with Friends
- \* Information posted to your profile



You can track your heartrate, distance and step count with your Fitbit, without needing an account.

- \* Government Entities
- \* Companies providing services to Fitbit
- \* Organizations you specifically direct Fitbit to share data with (e.g. Facebook)

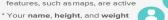

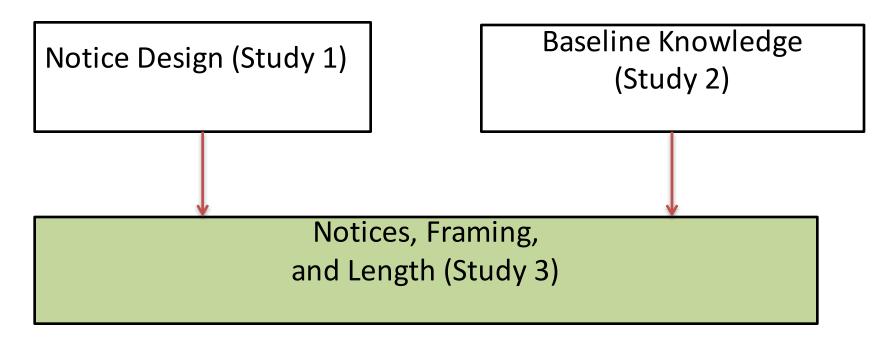

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## Study 3 Framing, and Length

• 3x3 experimental design + control

	Short	Medium	Long
Positive	Short/Pos.	Med./Pos.	Long/Pos.
Negative	Short/Neg.	Med./Neg.	Long/Neg.
Neutral	Short/Neutral	Med./Neutral	Long/Neutral

Control

### Participant Factors Matter

- Diverse Group of Users
  - Median Age 29, Range 18-69
  - 50.1% Female
- Older participants, women more aware

### Notices outperform Control

- Short-Form Notices increase user awareness of privacy practices
  - Reconfirmation of prior work
- Fitness wearables companies have been improving communication of practices
  - Ready made way for these companies to increase user awareness of privacy practices

## No effect of framing

 No statistically significant effect of framing on awareness (p=.19)

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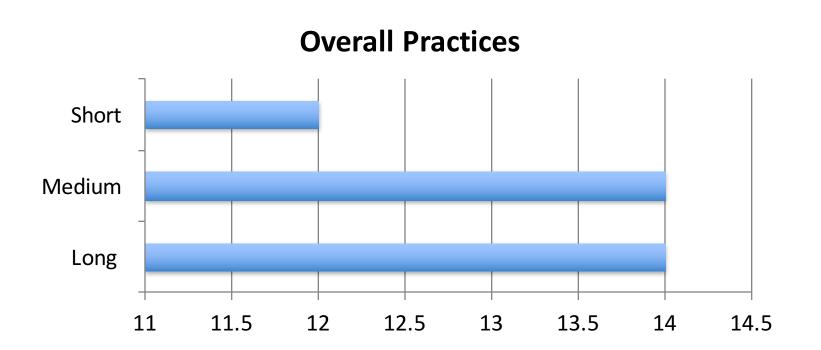

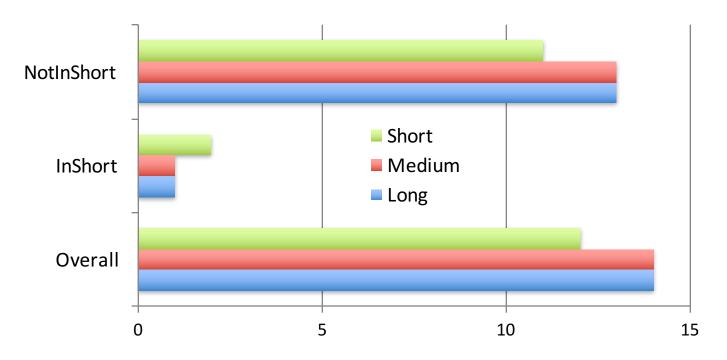

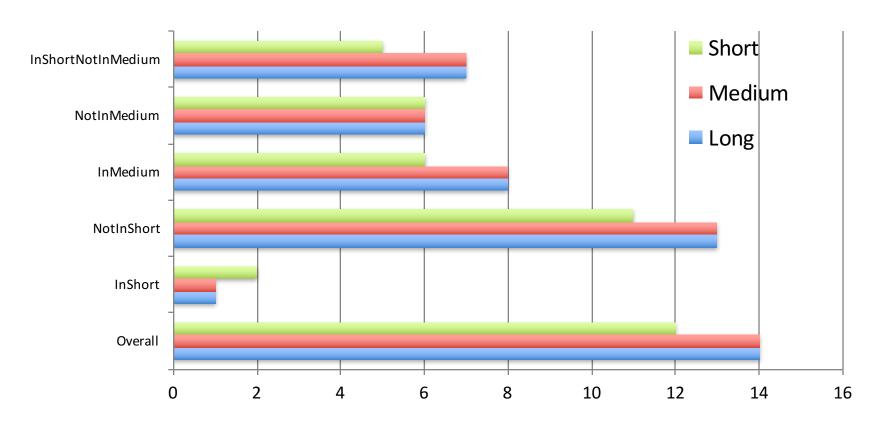
## Shortest Notices lead to less overall awareness



# Shortest does equally on remaining, worse on practices removed



### Medium Similar Performance as Long



## Results (Overview)

Short-Form notices were beneficial

No effect of framing on awareness

Shortest notices led to reduced awareness

Medium notices led to equal awareness

### Limitations

- Generalizability
- Wording of notice
- Mturk survey

## Take Aways

- Focusing on unexpected practices
  - Some practices can be removed with no negative effects
    - A method for determining these practices
  - There is a lower bound to notice length (policies must be included)
- Short-form notices are effective
