AUTHORIZATION AND LICENSE TO PUBLISH

A major mission of the USENIX Association ("USENIX") is to provide for the creation and dissemination of new knowledge. In order to facilitate this process, USENIX allows authors to retain ownership of the copyright in their works, requesting only that USENIX be granted the right to publish that work. Therefore, the parties agree as follows:

1. Grant of Rights to Publish. You hereby grant to The USENIX Association ("USENIX"), right to publish and re-publish the abstract of the poster provisionally entitled:

(the "Poster Abstract") in printed form, electronically, and in audiovisual formats (the "Rights"). USENIX's rights are non-exclusive, worldwide, perpetual and irrevocable, but also non-sublicensable and non-transferable. Among the rights you hereby grant to USENIX is the right to be the first publisher of the Poster Abstract. USENIX initially plans to publish the Poster Abstract in the following publication: Proceedings of LISA '14: 28th Large Installation System Administration Conference (the "Original Publication") and to mount the files permanently for display on the USENIX Web site, but may also otherwise disseminate the Poster Abstract, as well as the oral presentation of the Poster Abstract (either on media or as a live broadcast), and publish overheads or slides and audiovisual content related thereto on the USENIX Web server.

- 2. Posting. You retain all rights in the Poster Abstract subject to the non-exclusive rights granted to USENIX in Section 1 above.
3. Notice Request. USENIX will include the following notice on the first page of the Original Publication: "Copyright to this work is retained by the author[s]."
4. Subsequent Publication by Author. You must include a notice of original publication by USENIX in any subsequent publication of the Poster Abstract or a revised version of the Poster Abstract.
5. Warranties. You warrant that:
a. You are the sole author and owner of the Poster Abstract and the rights pertaining thereto or, if the Poster Abstract is a work of joint authorship, that all of the owners of the Poster Abstract have signed and submitted a copy of this document. If the Poster Abstract is owned by your employer, you warrant that you have obtained permission to enter into this agreement and to grant the rights herein described to USENIX.
b. USENIX does not need the permission of any other party to exercise the rights granted herein.
c. The Poster Abstract does not contain any defamatory or other unlawful content.
d. The Poster Abstract does not infringe upon the rights of others.
e. The Poster Abstract and its contents are original to you.
f. The Poster Abstract is not currently submitted for publication elsewhere and has not been previously published elsewhere.
g. If the Poster Abstract contains significant excerpts from other copyrighted materials, written permission from all of the copyright owners of those materials have been obtained, copies of such permissions are attached to this document, and proper credit and attribution has been given in the Poster Abstract itself.

6. Right to Withdraw Access. USENIX reserves the right to remove content and publications under its control from public access at any time for any reason. Occasionally, USENIX receives notices alleging that the content on its Web site, in its own publications, or in the papers and conference proceedings it publishes may infringe third party rights or may otherwise violate some law or regulation. USENIX does not usually take a position on the merits of these allegations. However, when this happens, USENIX will inform the authors of the allegations and may remove the identified content or publication from public access. USENIX may restore the material, at its discretion, when it deems appropriate. USENIX may also send the notice containing the allegations to Chilling Effects.
